










Roles and Responsibilities of State Representatives to the Committee of the Australian Police Rugby Union (A.P.R.U.)

New South Wales, Queensland, Western Australia and Federal Police.

-  Promote, support and foster the growth of Police Rugby Union within your respective policing bodies.
-  Provide assistance to the A.P.R.U. in promoting, supporting and fostering the growth of Police Rugby Union in Australia.
-  Provide support and assistance to the A.P.R.U. in the development of competition between Australia and other countries
-  Develop and maintain a player base to provide rugby competition between the Policing bodies within Australia.
-  Ensure that their respective policing body has a representative side participate in the Australian Police Rugby Union Championship held biannually.
-  Provide information to the A.P.R.U. in relation to upcoming games involving Police Rugby Union within your respective policing bodies.
-  At the Annual General Meeting (AGM) of the A.P.R.U. provide a list outlining the name, age, work location, playing position and short playing history of current players for your respective policing body. *This list can be provided in electronic form to the secretary prior to the AGM.*
-  Abide by their own state/territory and A.P.R.U. guidelines in relation to soliciting sponsorship or endorsement from public and/or private companies and/or individuals
-  Abide by the A.P.R.U. and their own state/territory Code of Conduct

South Australia, Victoria and Northern Territory.
